

Masonic Foundation of Ontario 50th Anniversary Project Hope Supporting Prostate Cancer Research The Mikey Network

Our Grand Master is continuing the project started by M. W. Bro. Donald A. Campbell, to support three prostate cancer research projects. Prostate cancer is the most common cancer among Canadian men (excluding non-melanoma skin cancers). It is the 3rd leading cause of death from cancer in men in Canada.



According to The Canadian Cancer Society, it is estimated that in 2015: -

- 24,000 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer. This represents 24% of all new cancer cases in men in 2015.
- 4,100 men will die from prostate cancer. This represents 10% of all cancer deaths in men in 2015.
- On average, 66 Canadian men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer every day.
- On average, 11 Canadian men will die from prostate cancer every day.

Fort McMurray Disaster



As with all things, as soon as pictures are no longer noteworthy, the incident drops from the news. Consider what it will take to do clean-up (How will they get all the ash and debris up? Where will they put all that ash?) and reconstruction. This disaster has not gone away just because it is no longer on our evening news. I have a Brother in my lodge who works in the oil sands. He was here at home when the fires went through. There are probably others in our district who have been evacuated from their

occupational homes and are now in temporary housing with minimal possessions. Consider their need.

Traditionally, Grand Lodge responds to disasters such as this via contributions to the Masonic Service Association of North America (M. S. A.). All jurisdictions throughout Canada and the U.S.A. can and do contribute and monies are directed to the specific incident.

The Fort McMurray Fire 2016 will go down in history as Alberta's largest fire or disaster in the history of Alberta and this is not the type of history that we like to remember or relate to in the future from a historical point of view. We cannot fathom the displacement of 100,000 persons or the inconvenience to each family that has been impacted. The Grand Lodge of Alberta extends prayers to all

who are impacted whether through a loss of home, business and / or career and we pray that this blaze will soon be snuffed out before impacting others.

The Grand Lodge Committee on Masonic Education offers interesting Correspondence Courses on Masonic Education throughout this Jurisdiction that is comprised of nineteen different modules.

Any Master Mason may take any module individually for \$10.00 each or they may wish to complete a course of study for a set fee. If a Brother takes an individual module today, and decides to complete a course of study later in time, he will be accredited with the module he has completed previously. In other words, he does not have to pay for or rewrite what he has already completed in the past. There are three courses of study offered by the College of Freemasonry:



- 1. The Masonic Arts and Sciences (eighteen modules).
- 2. The Past Master (six modules as of July 2014)
- 3. The Worshipful Master (eight modules).

Any Brother looking to run for the <u>DDGM of their District</u>, the <u>Board of General Purposes</u> or <u>Grand Registrar</u>, the course required by the Book of Constitution, Section 50(b) is the **Past Master's Course**. This course is also great for those looking to be a District Secretary.

Start of Ramadan

The month of Ramadan in which was revealed the Qur'an, a guidance for mankind, and clear proofs of the guidance, and the Criterion (of right and wrong). And whosoever of you is present, let him fast the month, and whosoever of you is sick or on a journey, (let him fast the same) number of other days. Allah desireth for you ease; He desireth not



hardship for you; and (He desireth) that ye should complete the period, and that ye should magnify Allah for having guided you, and that peradventure ye may be thankful.

Ramadan, also written *Ramazan*, *Ramzan*, *Ramadhan*, *Ramadan*, is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar. It is the Islamic month of fasting, in which participating Muslims refrain from eating, drinking, smoking, and indulging in anything that is in excess or ill-natured, from dawn until sunset.

Every day during the month of Ramadan, Muslims around the world get up before dawn to eat *Suhoor* or *Sehri* or *Sahari* (meaning "something we eat at Sahar"), then they perform the *fajr* (or Sobh) prayer. They have to stop eating and drinking before the call for prayer starts until the fourth prayer of the day, *Maghrib*. Muslims break their fast at Magrib (at sunset) prayer time with a meal called Iftar. Muslims may continue to eat and drink after the sun has set until the next morning's *fajr* prayer call. Then the process starts all over.



Fasting is meant to teach the Muslim patience, modesty and spirituality. Ramadan is a time for Muslims to fast for the sake of God (Arabic: Allah), and to offer more prayer than usual. During Ramadan, Muslims ask forgiveness for past sins, pray for guidance and help in refraining from everyday evils, and try to purify themselves through self-restraint and good deeds.

As compared to the solar calendar, the dates of Ramadan vary, moving forward about ten days each year, as it is a moving festival depending on the moon. Ramadan was the month in which the first verses of the Qur'an were revealed to the Islamic prophet Muhammad.


Having ridden last year in this event, I have seen many of the several hundred hard-working volunteers who staff the registration desk or load overnight gear onto trucks, who provide water, snacks and support at the various Pit Stops along the way or who provide encouragement at the Start and Finish Lines.



While I have focused on one rider who trains for and participates in this 200+ km event it is only fitting to pay tribute to all of the unsung "heroes" who allow the riders to "do their thing" with very few cares about safety, administration, First Aid, etc., etc., etc. So . . . it's not just all about the riders . . . the volunteers are great!!

<u>Training</u>: In the last issue, I had great hopes to do a lot of riding in April. Unfortunately, April was much colder than normal, as I think we would all agree. Cold weather, cool lake breezes, a stuffy nose and long bike rides don't seem to go together with bronchitis. So, I had to scale things back from my original plan.

As it turned out, I was only able to ride for a total of 162.7 miles, down from the 221.5 miles I logged last April. However, my average ride is better at 32.5 miles (vs. 27.7) so there is something positive to be said year-over-year . . . after all, I am a bean counter!!





<u>Fundraising Event</u>: I'm afraid that the fundraising event I had contemplated is going to have to be shelved for this year. Timing and other commitments have worked against me. However, as I plan to ride again, I hope to plan "an event" to support the 2017 Ride . . . stay tuned!!



Summer begins at 6:34 pm today! The common name for this event is the Summer Solstice. This is when the sun is as far North as it can go.


Farthest North - Tropic of Cancer - 23.5 degrees North (summer) Farthest South - Tropic of Capricorn - 23.5 degrees South (winter)
